

2024 FAIR GOLF CART RULES



Dear Campers & Fair Attendees,

Below is a list of Golf Cart Rules and regulations that need to be followed:

- 1. You must have a campsite during the 2024 fair and only one golf cart per campsite is permitted.
- 2. The golf cart must have lights and a manufactured standard exhaust. It is recommended that you have a horn. Golf carts must have a standard golf cart motor.
- 3. You must have proof of \$100,000 liability insurance with the Golf Cart listed on the policy and a Certificate of Liability from your insurance company that states: Additional Insured: Montgomery County Agricultural Society and the Montgomery County Commissioners, 645 Infirmary Road, Dayton, OH 45417.
- 4. A driver on the golf cart must be at least 16 years of age with a valid driver's license and covered by your insurance.
- 5. All registrations for the use of golf cart must be completed by June 30, 2024.
- 6. The fee is \$50.00 to use a golf cart during the week of the fair, July 7th 13th. Please send a check or money order payable to the MCAS.
- 7. Golf carts will only be permitted in the campground area, livestock trailer parking area and designated golf cart parking areas. Golf Carts are not permitted on the fairgrounds or access roads.
- 8. The Montgomery County Sheriff, Security and Board of Directors will enforce all rules. If you violate the rules, your cart will be confiscated, and it will be placed at the Sheriff's building until the end of the fair. No warnings will be issued. You may also lose your camping privileges.
- 9. Before entering the fairgrounds, the golf cart registration sticker must be displayed on the front of the golf cart or windshield. Permit shall be placed where the County Sheriff, and Fair Board Director can easily see it. Any attempt to copy a golf cart permit is strictly prohibited.
- 10. The Montgomery County Agricultural Society will not rent golf carts to anyone. You will need to contact a golf cart dealer and rent your own.d
- 11. The maximum number of persons that may ride on a golf cart at one time depends on the number of seats available. One rider per seat.
- 12. All riders on a golf cart must remain seated always.
- 13. The operation of a golf cart while under the influence of alcohol or drugs is strictly prohibited by the Ag Society and by state law. No person shall possess or consume alcohol or drugs while operating a golf cart on fairgrounds property and are subject to arrest.
- 14. Careless driving or behavior that endangers or would likely endanger any person or property will not be tolerated.
- 15. If you lose your golf cart sticker after it has been issued, there will be no replacement. The golf cart will not be allowed on the grounds.

ANY VIOLATION OF THE ABOVE RULES WILL RESULT IN BEING ASKED TO LEAVE THE CAMPGROUNDS IMMEDIATELY AND/OR LOSING YOUR GOLF CART AND CAMPING PRIVILEGES. DECISION AND THE DURATION OF LOST PRIVILEGES WILL BE DETERMINED BY THE DIRECTORS OF THE MONTGOMERY COUNTY AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY BOARD.

901:1-18-01 CHAPTER'S APPLICATION.

(A) Animals when moved within or imported into Ohio solely for exhibition purposes shall comply with the requirements of this chapter.
(B) Animals described in paragraph (A) of this rule who are in compliance with the rules of this chapter are exempt from the other rules governing movement within or importation into Ohio except for the rules governing movement and importation of quarantined animals.
(C) Animals moved within or imported into Ohio for any purpose in addition to exhibition shall meet all movement and import requirements of Chapter 901:1-17 of the Administrative Code.

901:1-18-02 DEFINITIONS

As used in this chapter:

(A) "Approved veterinarian" means any licensed and accredited veterinarian approved by the Ohio department of agriculture, or an employee of the Ohio department of agriculture or the United States department of agriculture, animal plant health inspection service, veterinary services.

(B) "Certificate of veterinary inspection" means a form from the state of origin which has been issued and completed by a licensed and accredited veterinarian attesting to the health status and identification of an animal listed thereon.

(C) "Contagious or infectious disease" means any disease, including any foreign animal disease, or vector, capable of transmission by any means from a carrier animal to a human or to another animal and includes dangerously contagious or infectious diseases.

(D) "Department" means the Ohio department of agriculture or its designee.

(E) "Exhibition" means any public show of animals which is sponsored by or under the control of an Ohio county or independent agricultural society organized under Chapter 1711. of the Revised Code; or the Ohio state fair; or which is assembled for a period which exceeds thirty-six hours or contains animals of origins other than Ohio.

(F) "Licensed and accredited veterinarian" means a person who is licensed by the state of Ohio to practice veterinary medicine and who is approved by the United States department of agriculture, animal plant health inspection service, veterinary services, to be an accredited veterinarian. 68

(G) "Residue" means any poisonous or deleterious pesticide governed by 40 C.F.R. 180 (2017), any poisonous or deleterious substance governed by 21 C.F.R. 109.6 (2017), or any other substance governed by 21 C.F.R. 556 (2017).

901:1-18-03 EXHIBITIONS: SANITATION, INSPECTION AND RECORDS

(A) Each entity sponsoring an exhibition shall have in attendance an approved veterinarian for the duration of the exhibition.

(B) Each entity sponsoring an exhibition shall:

(1) Under the direction of the approved veterinarian, thoroughly clean and disinfect each building, pen, stall, ring, or other enclosure in which animals are to be quartered for exhibition immediately prior to the exhibition;

(2) Have the approved veterinarian:

(a) Examine the certificate of veterinary inspection when required for an animal brought to the exhibition;

(b) Inspect within a reasonable time of arrival each animal brought to the exhibit for symptoms of any infectious or contagious diseases; and (c) Inspect each animal daily that is present at the exhibition for symptoms of infectious or contagious disease.

(3) Maintain a record for one year from the date of the exhibition of each animal present at the exhibition. The record shall contain the name and address of the owner of each animal and the species and breed of the animal.

(4) Order the immediate removal of any animal which, in the opinion of the approved veterinarian, places other animals at unacceptable risk of disease.

(C) The department may grant an exemption from paragraph (B)(1) of this rule upon request and for good reason.

901:1-18-04 EXHIBITORS

- (A) No person shall present for exhibition or exhibit an animal which he knows or has reason to suspect is infected with or has been exposed to a contagious or infectious disease or residue.
- (B) The owner or bailee of an animal with symptoms of an infectious or contagious disease shall immediately remove the animal from the exhibition premises when directed by an exhibition official, the approved veterinarian, or the department.
- (C) Each person who presents an animal for exhibition or exhibits an animal shall present any certificate of veterinary inspection, registration certificates, vaccination certificate, and other documents to exhibition officials, the approved veterinarian, or the department upon request.
- (D) Each person who presents an animal for exhibition or exhibits an animal for which a certificate of veterinary inspection is required by the rules of this Chapter shall forward a copy of the certificate of veterinary inspection to the department.
- (E) Failure to comply with the rules of this chapter may result in the department

901:1-18-05 POULTRY AND FOWL

(A) All turkeys, chickens and gamebirds moved within or imported into Ohio for exhibition must either:

(1) Originate directly from a flock or hatchery which is a participant in the national poultry improvement plan for the eradication of disease and be accompanied by documentary evidence that they meet the requirement of this paragraph;

(2) Originate directly from a flock which has had a negative test for pullorum/fowl typhoid disease within twelve months preceding the opening date of exhibition and be accompanied by documentary evidence that they meet the requirement of this paragraph;

(3) Have had a negative test for pullorum/fowl typhoid disease, within ninety days, preceding the opening date of the exhibition and be accompanied by documentary evidence that they meet the requirement of this paragraph; or

(4) Be tested for pullorum/fowl typhoid disease upon arrival at the exhibition by a tester approved by the Ohio department of agriculture and found negative.

(B) The rapid whole blood test shall not be used to test turkeys for compliance with the requirements of paragraphs (A)(2), (A)(3) and (A)(4) of this rule. (C) Waterfowl, doves and, pigeons are exempt from this rule.

901:1-18-06 CATTLE

(A) Cattle moved within Ohio for exhibition must show no symptoms or evidence of an infectious or contagious disease.

(B) All cattle imported into Ohio for exhibition must comply with rule 901:1-17-03 of the Administrative Code.

901:1-18-07 GOATS

(A) Goats moved within Ohio for exhibition:

(1) The animal presented for exhibition must show no symptoms or evidence of an infectious or contagious disease.

(2) All sexually intact animals and any wether eighteen months of age and older must be identified with an official identification as defined in rule 901:1-13-04 of the Administrative Code.

(B) Goats imported into Ohio for exhibition must comply with rule 901:1-17-06 of the Administrative Code.

901:1-18-08 HORSES, MULES AND PONIES

- (A) Horses, mules, asses, and ponies moved within Ohio for exhibition must show no symptoms or evidence of an infectious or contagious disease. If the animal is twelve months of age or older, the exhibition may require that the animal has been tested and classed negative to an official test for equine infectious anemia within twelve months of the opening date of the exhibition.
- (B) Horses, mules, asses, and ponies imported into Ohio for exhibition shall comply with rule 901:1- 17-07 of the Administrative Code.

901:1-18-09 SHEEP

(A) Sheep moved within Ohio for exhibition: 71

(1) The animal presented for exhibition must show no symptoms or evidence of an infectious or contagious disease.

- (2) All sexually intact animals and any wether eighteen months of age and older must be identified with an official identification as defined in rule 901:1-13-04 of the Administrative Code.
- (B) Sheep imported into Ohio for exhibition must comply with rule 901:1-17-08 of the Administrative Code.

901:1-18-10 SWINE

(A) Swine moved within Ohio for exhibition must show no symptoms or evidence of an infectious or contagious disease.

(B) Swine imported into Ohio for exhibition shall comply with rule 901:1-17-09 of the Administrative Code.

901:1-18-11 CAMELIDS

(A) Camelids including, but not limited to, llamas, alpacas and vicuñas moved within Ohio for exhibition purposes must show no

symptoms or evidence of an infectious or contagious disease.

(B) Camelids including, but not limited to, llamas, alpacas and vicuñas imported into Ohio for exhibition must comply with rule 901:1-17-15 of the Administrative Code.

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

<u>"NO PERSON SHALL BE PERMITTED TO MAKE SOLICITATIONS OF ANY NATURE ON THE FAIRGROUNDS EXCEPT</u> <u>IN CONTRACTED CONCESSION OR COMMERCIAL RENTED SPACES. NO PERSON WILL BE PERMITTED</u> <u>TO POST OR DISPLAY SIGNS, DISTRIBUTE HANDBILLS OR ADVERTISING MATERIAL OR SELL OR DISTRIBUTE</u> <u>FREE, ANY MERCHANDISE, EXCEPT PERSONS UNDER CONTRACT, AND WHO MUST OPERATE UNDER THE</u> <u>RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE MONTGOMERY COUNTY AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY."</u> (Photos taken on these grounds may be used for promotional use.)

- 1. During the Fair, all entrance gates will be opened daily at 10:00 a.m. and closed at 10:00 p.m. EXCLUDING SUNDAY
- 2. The Montgomery County Agricultural Society will use every possible means the safe preservation of articles, livestock and poultry entered for exhibition following their arrival and arrangement. However, Montgomery County Agricultural Society will not be responsible for damage to exhibits or livestock by fire, water, windstorm or any Act of God, nor does the Society assume any liability for loss by thefts or accidents to persons or property, nor for any errors or omissions in this Premium Book.
- 3. No alcoholic beverages are permitted in buildings or animal exhibit areas (including tents/structures).

ENTRIES AND EXHIBITORS Read the rules before making an entry. DO NOT ENTER IF YOU CANNOT STAY TO REQUIRED RELEASE TIME.

- 4. Unclaimed exhibits from commercial and competitive Departments will be considered abandoned if not called for within thirty days after the official closing of the Fair, and may be disposed of as the Committee Chairman of the Department sees fit.
- 5. All entries for exhibition must be made in the name of the bona fide owner of the animal or article or the premium will not be paid.
- 6. Closing dates for entries will be found in the heading of each Department.
- 7. Entry blanks, properly ruled, will be found in the middle of this premium book.
- Entries in the different Departments must be made on separate blanks. Only one exhibitor's entries to a blank form. All entries
 must be made on official entry blanks. Also, separate fees paid in each Department.
 EXTRA BLANKS MAY BE FOUND AT THE FAIRGROUNDS OFFICE OR ON-LINE
- 9. ANYONE SHOWING IN OPEN CLASS MUST PAY PEN FEES WHEN APPLICABLE.
- 10. All exhibits must be on the grounds by <u>Opening Day at 8:00 a.m.</u> or as specified by the head of each Department, with entry cards attached and will be under the control of the department members in charge until the close of the Fair.
- 11. Exhibitors must deliver their animals or articles to the member in charge of the proper Department and must claim them, promptly, at the specified time at the close of the Fair.
- 12. Exhibitors entering animals required to be pure-bred, must furnish Certificate of Registry in their respective herd, stud or flock books.
- 13. All animals shown as breeds must be such, in fact; if over three years old, must have produced living progeny, within the previous 18 months.

- 16. Exhibitors of cattle, swine, sheep and poultry: See Health Regulations on pages 33-35.
- 17. Exhibitors of livestock are required to keep their stalls open and in good order and their stock accessible to visitors, daily from 8:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. during the Fair.

- 18. Livestock exhibitors must be responsible for the removal of dead livestock during the Fair and thereafter, otherwise exhibitors will not receive premium money until the dead livestock is removed in accordance with the Chairman of the appropriate Department.
- 19. Livestock exhibits must remain in place until 11:30 p.m. on Saturday of the Fair Week. All stock must remain throughout the Fair or the exhibitor will forfeit their premiums. Articles in all Departments must be claimed by 1:00 p.m., on <u>Monday</u>. Articles unclaimed will be left at the exhibitor's risk.
- 20. All animals entered in competition must be exhibited in the Show ring to be eligible for premiums.
- 21. To insure , as far as possible, the safety of all livestock and articles exhibited in other Departments, no stoves, fires or <u>cooking of</u> <u>any kind will be permitted within nor closer than twenty feet from barns or buildings used for stabling or housing of exhibits.</u> Where possible all lights must be out by 12:00 p.m.
- 22. No Chutes in the Barns until 10:00 pm, Sunday night.
- 23. No driving stakes in the blacktop in any of the livestock barns.
- 24. Only LIMITED hay and feed to be brought into the barns.
- 26. Fair committee members shall serve as Superintendents of Departments and are authorized to decide all questions arising in their respective Departments not covered by these Rules and Regulations.
- 27. In cases where General Rules and Regulations conflict with Rules and Regulations governing Departments under which animals and articles are shown, Department rules will take precedence relative to the exhibit. Any point covered in the General Rules and not covered In Department rules, or vice versa, shall be considered as appearing in both.
- 28. JUDGES: Judges shall be procured for the judging of exhibits in each Department. Judges and members in charge shall see that proper tags are attached to all articles and animals entered for exhibition. PREMIUM TAGS MUST NOT BE ATTACHED TO ARTICLE OR ANIMALS FOR WHICH NO PREMIUMS HAVE BEEN OFFERED. Blue denotes first premium; red, second premium; yellow, third premium; white, fourth premium; green, fifth premium; royal purple, sweepstakes.
- 29. NO PREMIUM WILL BE AWARDED, WITH OR WITHOUT COMPETITION IN ANY DEPARTMENT, UNLESS THE JUDGE CONSIDERS THE EXHIBIT WORTHY OF AN AWARD.
- 30. Judges shall not award any discretionary premiums. When articles of superior merit are exhibited for which no premiums are offered, the members in charge shall make note of the fact in the class book and the Secretary/Treasurer will report same to the Society. Members In charge shall be permitted to use their discretion in recommending an award and shall note the fact in the class book. The Secretary/Treasurer will report this action to the Board.
- 31. If any disrespect is shown to an award or to the awarding judge by an exhibitor or their agents, the exhibitor shall forfeit all awards made to them and the member in charge shall report same to the Secretary/Treasurer upon return of the class book.
- 32. Protests relative to premiums may be made in writing to the Secretary/Treasurer before the close of the Fair. Decisions by the Judges will be considered final.
- 33. PREMIUM CHECKS WILL BE VOIDED 60 DAYS AFTER CHECK DATE. CHECKS WILL NOT BE RE-ISSUED. NO EXCEPTIONS!
- 34. Exhibitors, visitors or others are not permitted to tack signs to buildings, fences, or trees. It shall be the duty of the police to take into custody anyone so offending.
- 35. All protest from the current Fair have to be files with the Fair office within 48 hours from the conclusion of the Fair.



Montgomery County Junior Fair Board

The purpose of the Junior Fair Board is to plan, organize, manage, and direct the Montgomery County Junior Fair, with the assistance and under the supervision of the Montgomery County Senior Fair Board. Their goals are to promote youth activities at the Fair, to develop and demonstrate leadership and to provide a fun and educational environment for the youth of our communities. 4-H/FFA members ages 14 and in 9th Grade and older interested in appointments to the Junior Fair Board must complete and submit an application by November 1 to the OSU Extension Office.

Post Fair Jr. Fair Evaluation & Recommendation meeting will be Tues. September 24 at 6:30 p, at Calumet Center

JUNIOR FAIR GENERAL RULES

Montgomery County Jr. Fair competitive activities are open to 4-H members, Farm Bureau Youth, Girl Scouts & FFA from Montgomery County who are age 8 and in the 3rd grade as of January 1, and not have passed their 19th birthday as of January 1, current year. Other eligibility requirements of their respective organizations may apply.

- Montgomery County Junior Fair Market Livestock exhibitors must reside in, or attend school in, Montgomery County. Any student attending Montgomery County CTC whose legal school district is not in Montgomery County cannot exhibit their CTC School Project at the Montgomery County Fair. Petitions to cross county line will be considered on a case-by-case basis.
- 2. All Jr. Fair entries must be submitted through oh.4honline.com by the first Sunday in May for livestock and horses and by the 2nd Sunday in June for Rabbits and Poultry or through the FFA ADVISOR.
- 3. Exhibits are to represent work completed during the past year as part of their organization's activities. All projects and posters must be constructed in the year that the 4-H/FFA member is enrolled in that particular project and may not be used in any succeeding year. (Exception: insects and non-market animals). Violation of this rule will cause the project to be incomplete and ineligible for placing and return of premiums.
- 4. Like projects will not be allowed in more than one organization, i.e., participants cannot exhibit the same project in 4-H and FFA classes at the Montgomery County Fair.
- 5. It is a requirement that the 4-H/FFA member be present when their project is evaluated, as the judge will ask questions about the project. Evaluation serves as a learning tool. **Members who cannot be present must indicate this in writing to the Extension Office prior to the first day of the fair.**
- 6. Each 4-H Club member must attend 75% of their Club's meetings to be judged with their 4-H animals/projects. A minimum of 9 meetings or Club events are recommended. A Club may consider special field trips, workshops, workdays, fund-raising events, etc. as a meeting. Excused absence policy must be stated in the Club constitution and or by-laws. Discuss special situations with 4-H staff. College students meeting the age requirements for Junior Fair unable to be present for livestock judged at the Fair and who have attended at least 75% of their 4-H Club or FFA Chapter meetings for the project involved may have their animal shown by another Montgomery County Junior Fair Exhibitor.
- 7. Fair exhibit grades are given on a letter basis using A, B, C.
- 8. Fair Premiums will be earned on a maximum of three (3) projects and/or animals per person. Projects must be judged at County 4-H Judging or at the Fair Shows in order to receive Fair premiums. Cloverbud projects earn Fair premiums valued at \$5/child if displayed in 4-H Booth. Jr. Fair Exhibitors must pick up their Fair Premiums at the Fair Office, located inside the Event Center, from 1pm – 8pm Friday, July 5th – Saturday, July 13th.
- 9. Only members who are entered in the Junior Fair will receive a wristband and Fair premiums.
- 10. If there are less than three Junior Fair exhibitors and/or five exhibits in a class, trophies and special awards will be given at the discretion of the Judge and Show Committee.
- 11. No Junior Fair exhibitor will be permitted to stay on the grounds overnight unless staying with parent or legal guardian in campground. **No overnight accommodations in the barns/tents.**
- 12. Jr. Fair Exhibitors must follow dress code. Read these details in Dress Code section.
- 13. Exhibiting your animals and projects at the fair is an opportunity to learn, meet new friends, and have fun. The fair is also an opportunity for you to teach the public fair attendees about agriculture in Montgomery County.
- 14. While every precaution will be taken to protect animals, exhibitors and general public from loss or injury, the Montgomery County Agricultural Society, OSU Extension and FFA staff and their volunteers will not be responsible for loss or injury.

JR. LIVESTOCK AND SMALL ANIMALS DIVISION RULES

- 1. Only animals which are to be exhibited in a graded class are to be brought to the Fair.
- 2. Upon arrival at the Fairgrounds, all livestock exhibits are subject to health regulations of the Ohio Department of Agriculture as stated in this book and in the Revised Livestock Exhibition Rules http://codes.ohio.gov/oac/901-19.
- 3. ALL animals must be inspected by the Fair Veterinarian before the exhibitor can stall or pen their animals. Animals can arrive at the Fairgrounds no earlier than 8:00 am Saturday and no later than 8 pm, Saturday before the Fair. Exceptions: Market Rabbits and Market Turkeys & Chickens can arrive between 12 noon 8:00 pm Saturday and will check in with Barn Superintendents prior to penning (see specific section rules). All hogs arrive on Monday 8am-10am; Horses arrive Sunday 10am 2pm; Breeding Rabbits & Breeding Poultry arrive on Thursday 8am-9am.
- 4. Livestock exhibits must remain in place until 11:30 p.m. on Saturday of the Fair Week unless listed otherwise in schedule, or approved by Sr. Fair Directors. Early removal will be cause for forfeiture of awards and fair premiums.
- 5. No storage, chairs, etc. is permitted in the aisle ways and along the walls in any barn. Exhibitors MUST clean stalls, pens, and coops when their animals are removed. Storage permitted ABOVE pens (6' x 6').
- 6. All show times subject to change. Exhibitors assume full responsibility for meeting show and weighing schedule.
- 7. Barns, stalls, aisles, feed and supplies are to be kept neat, clean and orderly. Each exhibitor is responsible for own animal(s) and bedding until they are removed. Any animals, pen, or supplies not kept clean and orderly will receive a written warning to be signed by member and advisor. Exhibitor has four hours to clean up animal area. If a second notice is given, the animal will be removed from Fair and forfeit premiums and placings of all species exhibited.
- 8. Livestock must be shown by the MEMBER unless they have two animals in the same class. If this happens, the second animal can be shown by any active Montgomery County Jr. Fair Exhibitor. Other conflicts in show schedules should be brought to the Superintendents or Extension staff. College student exception applies.
- 9. All animals exhibited must have been a part of the member's project and cared for by the individual member on and after specified possession dates. Ownership of an animal will be considered lost if after possession date of the current year, the animal has been CONSIGNED OR SOLD in any type of transaction, even if the member buys back that animal.
- 10. For all market animals with pre-registrations (beef, sheep, swine, goats), each 4-H or FFA member can register a maximum of three (3) market lambs, four (4) meat goats; six (6) hogs (can be combination of market gilts, market barrows, or purebred); (2) feeder calves and two (2) steers/mkt heifers. If siblings have not registered in the maximum of market animals, one additional animal can be registered and designated as a "family" animal that can be used by any eligible sibling. An eligible sibling is a Jr. Fair exhibitor who has already registered at least one market animal in the same species as the family animal. 'Family' animals entered in the Junior Fair must have a sibling name entered on the Junior Fair entry form.
- 11. Animals cannot be replaced after specified possession deadline. Selection of show sale animals must be made before animals go over the scale. Possession dates listed in each Department.
- 12. Only market animals may be sold in the Junior Fair Livestock Sale. Sale order will be by random assignment except for those animals judged as Grand and Reserve Champions which will sell as first in their specie.
- 13. **Exhibitors must declare if animal is not selling at the fair weigh-in scale.** Each animal/pen will be charged a 4% sales fee. Certain species also have a mandatory check-off amount deducted.
- 14. Sale checks can be picked up at any of the given pickup dates from the Calumet Center. Checks will be given out after all buyers have paid their invoices and Thank You notes have been turned in.
- 15. No professional grooming is permitted. (Assistance other than Montgomery County 4-H Advisors, immediate family, or 4-H members is not permitted.) Immediate family means: exhibitor's parent, step-parent, foster parent, grandparent, step-grandparent, foster grandparent, brother, sister, step-brother, step-sister, half-brother, half-sister, son, daughter, step-son, stepdaughter, or guardian.

- 16. All animals must not have horns at the Fair, including feeder calves. Exception: certain breeds of breeding goats.
- 17. All animals must be broke to lead. Unruly animals will be sent home and do not show. Final determination will be
- made by Superintendents.
- 18. Animals must show to sell.
- 19. At Fair weigh-in and during the Fair, Junior Fair specie committees will check animals for injury or sickness and work with Fair Veterinarian to make recommendations regarding the show and sale. Final decision to send an ill or injured animal home is made by the Fair Veterinarian. Members are responsible for immediate removal of ill or injured animals.
- 20. Each Junior Fair exhibitor with a **market or lactating animal and** one parent must complete the Montgomery County Quality Assurance (QA) Program to participate in the Montgomery County Junior Fair Livestock and Dairy Shows or have tested out for their age group. This completion is required 45 days prior to Fair weigh-in.
- 21. Any injections or medication of any kind given to any animal on the Fairgrounds must be administered by the Fair Veterinarian.
- 22. Members must accompany their own animals to the scales on weigh-in day at the Fair unless prior arrangements have been made with the Superintendents.
- 23. All meat animal, meat poultry, meat rabbits, feeder calves, milking cows, and milking goats must complete the online Drug Use Notification Form (DUNF) for each animal or pen of meat poultry/rabbits at the time of weigh-in at the fair. Said animals must also be past the prescribed withdrawal date for medications at fair weigh-in. Only the Fair Veterinarian can make exceptions on this withdrawal ruling.
- 24. Any Junior Fair Exhibitor pulling their animal from competition once they have entered the show area, and without permission from show personnel, will be disqualified from the show, will not sell and will forfeit all premiums and awards won at the current year Fair. The exhibitor and all members of immediate family may be barred from competition at county fair for next 3 years.
- 25. Tampering and or misrepresentation as to breeding, age, ownership and any other irregularity in showing will be considered fraud and deception. Premiums, trophies, awards or sale money won will be withheld. The Montgomery County Agricultural Society reserves the right to disqualify any animal fitted in an unethical manner and disqualify the exhibitor and the exhibitor's assistants who fitted the animal involved.
- 26. Unethical fitting shall include any cutting or tearing of the hide, cutting or tearing underneath the hide or removal of tissue in any attempt to alter the shape or appearance. It shall also include attempts to disrupt or change normal dental development, dyeing, powdering, or coloring hair, adding artificial tailheads, switches, polls, hair and heels, as well as any attempt to change the conformation and degree of firmness by administration of fluids or air internally or externally in a liquid, solid or gaseous state. Transparent grooming materials only may be used. Water only may be used on hogs. The use of Clenbuterol and other unapproved drugs is prohibited. All exhibitors, their immediate family and any other parties involved in unethical fitting and showing of an animal will be barred from exhibiting or showing at the Montgomery County Fair and will forfeit all premiums, prize money and awards won in any Jr. and or open classes. **VIOLATIONS WILL BE REPORTED TO ODA**
- 27. SHOULD FRAUD OR DECEPTION, AND PROOF, AS DETERMINED BY THE AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY, BE DISCOVERED AFTER THE ANIMAL OR ANIMALS HAVE BEEN SHOWN AND PRIOR TO THE SALE, such animal(s) shall not be permitted to sell. The animals placing next in line at the show shall move up.
- 28. SHOULD VIOLATION BE DISCOVERED AFTER THE SALE, all sale money shall be returned to the buyer and the animal, carcass or carcass value shall be returned to the exhibitor. All placings in show will stand. NO animals will move up. Any carcass suspected of being tampered with or suspected of containing drugs will be detained until the investigation is complete.
- 29. IF THE CARCASS IS CONDEMNED at the packing plant for any reason, it shall be grounds for disqualification in the on-foot and carcass division of the show. Additionally, all premiums and sale money shall be forfeited and the loss of the animal be incurred by the exhibitor.
- 30. The Montgomery County Agricultural Society has the authority to hold the Grand and Reserve Champion and any project entry being tested in a secured building until released by O.D.A. The project owner must maintain feed, water and help with transportation to the processing plant when released by the O.D.A. and Montgomery County Agricultural Society. A representative from the Montgomery County Agricultural Society and the exhibitor/owner's family must accompany Champion animal to processing plant.

- 31. All rules, regulations and guidelines for Junior Fair Livestock, Poultry and Rabbit Departments are recommended to the Senior Fair Board's Livestock Committee from the Junior Fair Livestock Committee. These are volunteers interested in youth development as it relates to our Junior Fair Livestock program. Suggestions for improving our Junior Fair can be presented to this group. Voting privileges are extended to 4-H/FFA parents, grandparents, legal guardians, 4-H Volunteers, Junior and Senior Fair Board members, Jr Fair Superintendents who have completed two of the three previous meetings.
- 32. In the event that an acceptable packer buyer is not acquired for a market animal species by the Jr. Fair Sale Committee, the member will be responsible to market their own animal and could receive only the premium bid for their eligible individual market project minus the current year's sale commission fee.

TESTING FOR DRUGS

The Montgomery County Agricultural Society and The Ohio Department of Agriculture shall have the right to test any animal prescribed by the Society to determine if a substance has been administered to change the conformation or temperament of the animal.

JUNIOR FAIR RULE VIOLATIONS

In the question of a rule violation the following due process will be used: exhibitor and/or parties involved will be questioned by Fair officials. If it is felt a violation has occurred, Fair officials will make recommendations to the designated committee of the Agricultural Society which is appointed to department in question. After committee hears allegations and or evidence, they will decide if the case should be brought before the full Board of Directors. In the decision of allegations being brought before the Board, all parties involved will be notified of a meeting date with all parties having the right to present their views and/or evidence. Upon hearing the case, the Fair Board will make the ruling. When satisfactory evidence has been obtained by the Montgomery County Fair Management that any of the livestock rules have been violated, the exhibitor and or exhibitors' family may be barred from showing in any future Montgomery County Agricultural Fairs. The minimum number of years for barment is three (3) years before the right to review. In case any premium shall have been awarded to animals shown in violation of this rule, the Montgomery County Fair Management will request the exhibitor to refund all premiums, trophies, awards, ribbons, and sale money under such violation. Unless fraud and/or deception are involved, all championship placing stand.

PROTEST AND APPEALS

Protests must be made in writing, signed by party or parties making protest, and filed with the Executive Secretary and the Junior Species Superintendent <u>no later than 4 hours</u> from the end of the fair. This team will make recommendations to the Fair Board by noon the following day after protest is received. A protest fee of \$100 is required. The Montgomery County Agricultural Society will retain fee if protest is not sustained. The Executive Secretary shall hear protests with the Superintendent of the department involved and if necessary other people will be involved as designated by the Executive Secretary. All protests will be considered at a time set by the Executive Secretary of the Montgomery County Agricultural Society Board and all parties will be notified.

IMPORTANT NOTICE

The Ohio Department of Agriculture Revised LIVESTOCK EXHIBITION RULES are not printed in this Fair Book but are available at the Fairgrounds Offices to a Livestock Exhibitor or adult supervisors upon request, as time permits. **QUALITY ASSURANCE TRAINING TO EXHIBIT AND SELL LIVESTOCK: YOUTH EXHIBITORS AND ONE PARENT OR GUARDIAN MUST COMPLETE THE ANNUAL MONTGOMERY COUNTY QUALITY ASSURANCE TRAINING if these members are showing market animals or lactating animals in the Montgomery County Fair.** Trainings are conducted by OSU Extension. Junior exhibitors with meat and market animals, meat poultry, meat rabbits, feeder calves and milking cows and milking goats must participate in Quality Assurance training. **QA trainings must be completed 45 days before Fair weigh-ins.**

JUNIOR FAIR GOOD PRODUCTION PRACTICES

"Assuring Quality Care for Animals" relates to food safety and protection and are listed below. Animal owners are responsible to assure that proper management and welfare are at the core of animal care. The 10 Good Production Practices (GPP's) are:

- 1. Use an appropriate veterinarian/client/patient relationship (VCPR) as the basis for medication decision making.
- 2. Establish and implement an efficient and effective health management plan.
- 3. Use antibiotics responsibly.
- 4. Properly store and administer animal health products.
- 5. Follow proper feed processing protocols.
- 6. Establish effective animal identification, medication records and withdrawal times.
- 7. Practice good environmental stewardship.
- 8. Maintain proper workplace safety.
- 9. Provide proper animal handling and care.
- 10. Utilize tools for continuous improvement.

DRESS CODE MONTGOMERY COUNTY 4-H/FFA LIVESTOCK SHOWS

- 1. Suitable attire for exhibiting and selling shall include the following: long or short sleeve shirts with collars of proper fit and size. Shirt may only have one button undone at the collar. (We will allow 4-H Club crew neck t-shirts.) Shirt must cover the midriff and bosom at all times when showing the animal. Exhibitor may wear 4-H, FFA or Farm Bureau clothing when exhibiting. No other lettering or logo on the apparel is permitted. Long pants (full length) of the proper fit and size are permitted. No oversized pants, capri pants or shorts allowed. Shoes and boots that provide proper foot protection are required. No open toe shoes or sandals. No hats are to be worn during exhibiting, except for horses. Conservative, well-coordinated colors and fabrics are preferred. The exhibitor's overall appearance should be clean and neat, reflecting pride in self, animal and 4-H//FFA.
- 2. Poultry and Rabbit exhibitors are required to wear white long or short sleeved shirts or show jackets to exhibit with the standard from rule 1. Area, APA, ARBA, and breed patches are permitted.
- 3. Dairy exhibitors are required to wear white shirts and white pants to exhibit with the standard from rule 1. For goat exhibitors, show whites are preferred for dairy goats; Fair attire for boer goats.
- 4. For dress code violation: You will not be permitted to show your animal you will forfeit premiums and the right to sell animal.

GENERAL SHOWMANSHIP CONTEST RULES

- 1. Competing animals are to be owned by participant and can be any animal that exhibitor is showing as a 4-H or FFA project animal in the current Junior Fair.
- 2. Junior, intermediate, and senior divisions, (may be divided or combined day of show based on # of entries):
 - a. Junior 8-11 years old as of Jan. 1, current year.
 - b. Intermediate 12-14 years old as of Jan. 1, current year.
 - c. Senior 15-18 years old as of Jan. 1, current year.

If only two showmanship classes held, the age divisions will be: Junior – ages 8-13; Senior – ages 14-18.

- 3. Judges will consider these points:
 - a. The general appearance of the animal, cleanliness, how fitted, behavior, etc.
 - b. The general appearance of the exhibitor, to include proper clothing without commercial advertising.
 - c. The ability of the competitor to maneuver the animal as directed by the judge.
 - d. The knowledge of the animal, show techniques and procedures as demonstrated by the exhibitor.
- 4. Junior, intermediate, senior division winners will compete for department showman. The winner in each livestock species will compete in their respective large or small animal overall showman of showmen contest.
- 5. Junior Fair exhibitor unable to participate in Showmanship must participate in the specie Skill-a-thon or be interviewed by the judge. Members not participating in one of these three events will not show nor sell animals in the sale.
- 6. Previous Overall Showman of Showmen Contest Winners are ineligible to enter the overall contest during their show years and are exempt from the interview requirement. He/She may again enter showmanship in any other species. Should Overall Winner win the species showman of showmen, the Reserve Species winner will participate in the Overall Contest for the current fair. Should this described situation occur, the species awards stay with the respective winners.

- 1. The winner of each Showmanship Contest in Beef, Sheep, Swine, Horses, Meat Goats, and Dairy Goats will compete in the Showman of Showmen Contest. One alternate (Reserve) will be selected in each species. Each winner will attend a mandatory meeting to review contest rules and procedures at 9:00 am, Thursday. Respective specie showman is asked to verify their participation in the overall contest no later than 2 hours after their specie contest.
- 2. If an individual wins representation in two or more species, that individual will represent each species won. Should the specie showman of showman be unable to participate due to illness, injury, or family concerns, then only the alternate (Reserve) is eligible to take their place. Should a specie representative choose to voluntarily not participate in this Overall contest, they will forfeit the first place awards. In this situation, those awards will be given to the exhibitor who actually participates in the Overall Contest.
- 3. Each participant competes by showing animals in all contest species. Working with judge, each participant will give a demonstration in their specie after that class judging. During class, judge will have youths switch animals and ask questions about the animals. The switch of animals is strongly suggested by the judge and contest committee.
- 4. The Junior Fair Superintendent of each participating department, working with this show committee, will select the animals to use in the Showman of Showmen Contest. Animals are to be of equal show-ability. Lots will be drawn by contestants to determine which animal they will show. If enough animals of equal show-ability are not available, the superintendents for that species will work with this committee to accommodate the situation, i.e. horses.
- 5. The Champion Showman of Showmen will be determined by their knowledge, ability to handle livestock, courtesy in the show ring, and use of accepted show ring practices and customs.
- 6. Dress code: See general dress code policy.
- 7. Each Judge will be given 15 minutes to judge their specie. The Scoring Staff will check the time and a five-minute warning will be announced. The only exception to this rule will be the horses; however, the judges will be asked to move through their class in a timely manner.
- 8. Order of the show will be as follows: Horse, Swine, Beef, Sheep, break to announce Small Animal Showmen, Market Goat, Dairy Goat
- 9. Placing 1-7 will be awarded with 1 point for 1st place 2 points for 2nd and so on. The lowest total score wins. Results during the contest will NOT be announced. After the contest, score sheets can be obtained by request for contest participants only.
- 10. In case of tie, winner is determined by highest number of 1st class placings in the Showman of Showman classes. If there is still a tie, then the highest number of 2nd class placings will be used, and so on until the tie is broken.

JUNIOR FAIR PREMIER EXHIBITORS & SKILL-A-THONS

One exhibitor in each Junior Fair species (beef, dairy, goat, sheep, swine, rabbits, poultry, and horses) will be recognized as the Premier Exhibitor in their species. This honor and monetary award will be determined by points earned for placings in three events: skill-a-thon contest, Record Book scoring, showmanship, and show placing. Format and process is modeled after the Ohio State Fair Outstanding Market Exhibitor program.

Skill-a-thon Contests: Skill-a-thons for ALL SPECIES will be conducted on **Monday** July 1 from 5 pm – 8 pm. Registration closes at 7:30 pm, is a member is in line for a species station by 8pm that participation will be honored. Each species skill-a-thon will consist of five stations, with one station being a QA Test stop and one the scoring of your 4-H or FFA project livestock record book. To prepare for the skill- a-thon stations, study the respective 4-H handbooks, resource books, and project books for each species. Know the Good Production Practices (GPPs) and related Quality Assurance information. Members may participate in all species skill-at-hons even if they are not enrolled in a project in that species. To earn the Premier Exhibitor, said exhibitor must have a completed project record book for that species. Poor sportsmanship, poor animal husbandry, or undesirable behavior may affect Premier Exhibitor placing.

Skill-a-thon and Premier Exhibitor Awards: Sponsored by Farm Credit Services of Mid-America and Montgomery County Farm Bureau

Cash prizes will be awarded for skill-a-thons in each species. Age divisions in each species are determined by 4-H/FFA enrollments in each species. Fair premium checks will be issued as follows: 1st place - \$20; 2nd place - \$15; 3rd place - \$10; Premier Exhibitor - \$100 or suitable award

- If an Exhibitor has a Grand or Reserve Grand Champion animal, they may enter the sale ring a second time, provided they have more than one animal exhibited in said Champion species.
- Appropriate dress is expected in the Sale Ring. See Dress Code section. Advertising on shirts is allowed in sale.
- 1. Minimum sale weights: Market Beef 900 lb.; Feeder Calf 350-900 lb.; Hogs 220-280 lb.; Lambs 95 lb.; Goats 55 lb.
- 2. Exhibitors must care for market animals until removed from fairgrounds. Animals remain the responsibility of the Junior Fair seller until the carcass is approved at the processing plant.
- 3. Exhibitors must declare if animal is or is not selling at the fair weigh-in scale.
- 4. Exhibitors and their families are to provide and be responsible for appropriate security for their market animal projects, including their Champion and Reserve Champion projects, until hauled for harvest.
- 5. Sale expenses deducted from Jr. Fair Sale animals premium bid will be at 4%. In addition to any regular county fair sale expenses for swine, steers & lambs have a check-off deduction for the respective state or national commodity boards for promotion, consumer education and research of the species.
- 6. ALL Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion Hogs, Lambs, Market Goats, Steers, Meat Rabbits, Meat Chickens and Market Turkeys will be sold. All Grand and Reserve Grand Champion Hogs, Lambs, Boer Goats, and Market Beef will be harvested at either an ODA or USDA licensed plant in a timely manner. The Junior Fair Livestock Committee and Montgomery County Agricultural Society will provide a basic chain of evidence from the auction to the harvesting plant. Exhibitors and their families shall provide and be responsible for appropriate security for Grand Champion and Reserve Champion animals until harvested.
- 7. ALL Grand and Reserve Grand Champion animals will be harvested.
- 8. Grand/Supreme Champion and Reserve Grand/Supreme Champion buyers will receive recognition banners.
- 9. Sale order for exhibitors with market animals will be determined by random drawing.
- 10. Sale checks issued to exhibitor AFTER all Thank You cards have been turned in and buyer invoices have been paid.
- 11. Turn in Thank You cards at the Calumet Center on Saturday, July 24th 11am 1pm; Saturday, August 10th, 11am

- 1pm; Saturday, August 24th 11am - 1pm; Monday, September 16th 6pm - 8pm. Cards should be in envelopes, addressed, postage stamped, but NOT sealed. The Exhibitor need not be present. Cards can be brought in by a family or club member. Cards will be reviewed by Jr. Livestock Committee Officers and Extension staff.

How to Be a Sale Buyer – Support Our Youth

- 1. PREVIOUS YEAR INDIVIDUAL AND BUSINESS BUYERS receive a courtesy packet prior to the Fair.
- 2. **NEW BUYERS:** Get a Bid Number before the Sale at the Clerk's Office inside the NW corner of the Main Event Center. Use that same Bid Card Number at all the current year Jr Fair Livestock Sales.
- 3. WHEN YOU ARE BIDDING ON A MEMBER PROJECT: The BID you make is on the child's 4-H/FFA project. That project 'lot' could be 1,2,3, or 4 animals depending on the species. The youth exhibitor only brings in one of those animals to the Sale Ring. When you bid, you are letting the auctioneer know the price that you are willing to pay for that exhibitor's entire project, i.e., 2 hogs. That price is called a 'premium bid'. The exhibitor receives the total of the premium bid money, less 4% to help with sale expenses. *Example A:* You bid \$500 for the lamb project and send the lamb to market *(see value listed on the Sale Sheet)*. Your cost will be \$500. Besides your BID amount, the child also gets that market value. *Example B:* You bid \$500, and you take one or more of those project animals' home *(usually to deliver to the processor of your choice)* your cost is the market value listed on the Sale Sheet AND the bid amount.
- **4. BUYING THE 4-H MEMBER PROJECT:** Raise your Bid Card if you are interested in purchasing a child's project this lets the ringman & auctioneer know you want included in the bidding for this 'lot'. When the animal is declared "sold", hold your bid card high so that it can be seen by the auctioneer, be recorded in our paperwork, and your recognition given. *Opening bid is the multi-buyer card if a youth's family has one.*
- 5. MULTIPLE BUYERS ON ONE PROJECT: The Multi-Buyer Card is a list of buyers who have joined together and committed a specific amount to one youth exhibitor towards their project, i.e., \$1000 to Linda's lamb project. Before the Fair, the parent of an exhibitor may ask if you are willing to be a part of this multi-buyer card, i.e., \$100 of the total amount. That Card is turned in by the child or parent to the Clerk's Corner by 5:00pm the day PRIOR to the Sale
- 6. WHAT TO DO WITH ANIMAL:
 - SEND TO MARKET we handle that sale for you.
 - **TAKE HOME TONIGHT** you take home & make arrangements with the processor of choice.
- 7. MAKE PAYMENT at the Clerk's Corner in the Main Event Center no later than 2 hours after the Sale ends. ALL business billing arrangements must be made prior to the Sales with Sale Clerk Linda Rowley, <u>lrowley.246@gmail.com</u> Note: credit cards are accepted; however a 3.5% fee will be added.

JUNIOR FAIR MARKET BEEF/DAIRY CLASSES AND SHOW ORDER

All classes will be shown by weight as determined at Weigh-In. Animals will be tagged at weigh-in scale.

BEEF AND DAIRY FEEDER CALVES

- 1. Born after December 1, 2023. Must be weened and in member possession by May 1. Heifers can be taken as beef/dairy feeders and will remain in market classes and cannot be shown in breeding classes. Male animals must be castrated by May 1.
- 2. No more than 4 entries per exhibitor. 2 beef and 2 dairy.
- 3. Pre-registration photos and info are due online by 1st Sunday in May
- 4. Calves must be de-horned and healed before coming to the fair. Males not fully castrated will not show and will not sell.
- 5. Feeder calf exhibitors may show and sell 2 beef AND 2 dairy calves through the livestock sale. Calves must weigh between 300 and 900 pounds to be sold in the sale.
- 6. At the weigh-in scale, calves will be tagged, members declare if animal is to be sold or taken **home. Online DUNF forms must be completed.**
- 7. Market Heifer Feeder Calves may continue as Market Heifers or Breed Heifers the following year.

STEERS AND MARKET HEIFERS

- 1. All Steers and Market Heifers must be on feed, in exhibitor's possession by December 1, 2022. All Market Beef/Dairy must be born after December 1, 2022 and must be registered by designated date in December.
- 2. Youth may register no more than three (3) steers/market heifers, then show and sell two (2) steers/market heifers at the Fair. Steers/market heifers must weigh at least 900 pounds at weigh-in to sell in the sale.
- 3. Any Steer that arrives at the Fair not fully castrated will not show and will not go through the livestock sale. Fair Veterinarian and superintendents will have final ruling. All market beef must be de-horned and healed
- 4. At the weigh-in scales, animals will be tagged. Members will declare if animal is to sell or be taken home. Online DUNF form must be completed. Calves weighing less than 900 pounds will be shown in an underweight class and be ineligible for championship classes.
- 5. Champion Born and Bred will NOT show in the final drive.
- 6. In the interest of safety, any steer/mkt heifer that cannot be led at any time during the Fair may be sent home. Decisions to be made by Beef Superintendents and a member of the Extension Staff.
- **7. 2024 Junior Fair Steer Registrations** will be due December 15, 2023. For details, contact the Extension Office or Superintendents. Steers must be in possession of youth exhibitors by December 1st.

A member may have 4 animals tagged in, including up to 3 county born and raised entries. May bring 3 Jr. Fair Animals (2 Market and 1 county born and raised) to Jr. Fair. Animals to be shown at Jr. Fair must be selected before animals go over scale, including county born and raised entry. The two selected lambs can sell through the sale ring, with the 3rd lamb sold at market price and not through the sale ring.

- Crossbred entries will show by weight and gender. Classes will be broken based on the number of entries, with no more than 10 animals per class. The1st place winner in each weight class will enter their respective gender Champion Drive, with 2nd place class winners on deck for the Reserve Champion Drive.
- All purebred animals must be registered in the name of the exhibitor, farm name, or family name. **Registration papers will be** reviewed at the weigh-in scales. The purebred show will combine gilts and barrows in one class per breed, provided other requirements and show numbers are met. Purebred entries will show by breed and weight only. Weight classes will be no more than 10 animals.
- The Supreme Champion Drive will consist of all Champions selected. There will be a total of 5 overall placings in this Drive. Supreme Grand Champion and Reserve Supreme Hogs MUST sell in the Jr. Fair Sale and be harvested..
- 1. Members MUST register and can show any combination of up to 6 head of hogs (barrow, gilt, purebred).
- 2. 2. Members must have animals registered photo of the EID tag number that is readable in the pigs ear, along with photos of left-side, right-side, and a head of each hog by the first Saturday of May. EID tags can be obtained from the Extension Office, if you do not have own. No tags at fair weigh-in! All barrows must be castrated by the first Saturday in May. For 'family' animal see Rule# 10 under 'Jr Fair Livestock and Small Animal Rules' in the front of this Jr. Fair Section.
- 3. All hogs may be sold at 'market' price or be taken home. This decision to sell or take home is made at the weigh-in scale!
- 4. Any market barrow that arrives at the Fair not fully castrated will not be shown and will not go through the livestock sale. Fair Veterinarian and superintendents will have final ruling authority.
- 5. SHAVINGS are highly recommended for bedding hogs. Ground corn cobs may used for bedding, but kickboards open to the aisle ways side MUST be used. NO STRAW.
- 6. Pens should be cleaned daily and aisle ways swept often. Members with pens not cleaned after one warning will forfeit their Fair winnings.
- 7. Show boxes and similar storage containers will be stored over the top of 6 ft. x 6 ft. pens only. No storage, chairs, etc is permitted in the aisle ways or along the wall space.
- 8. **The Showmanship entry** must be one of the hogs shown in Junior Fair. Once the hog entry for showmanship is determined, that same animal will be used through all hog showmanship classes for the one designated exhibitor.
- 9. Hogs may only be shaved on tail and ears. All other clippings must have at least 1/2 inch of hair.
- 10. Water only may be used in grooming.

ALL market goats will be wethers or meat wether does. Meat wether does will show in separate classes from meat wethers and will have a Grand and Reserve awards, but not required to sell.

Breeding Stock Leases: Must be turned in by 10am on first Monday in May at Extension Office or attached in 4-H Online Entry.

All goats register online either by a scrapies tag, registry ID, or implant from the point of origin according to Ohio Code State Specific Regulations Scrapie-- 901:1-13 *Purpose:* to enable trace back of animals that test positive for scrapie or another program disease to their flock or herd of origin, and trace out of exposed animals from infected and source flocks. The Ohio State Veterinarian has final authority.

All wethers and meat wether does must have the USDA scrapies tag. The scrapies tag must be in the ear and visible in the online registration photos due the 1st Saturday of May. Animals arriving at the Fair with NO scrapies tag will result in the animal being sent home. Superintendents and Director have final say.

- 1. Maximum of six market class entries and 6 breeding/exotic class entries. Stalling is two goats per pen.
- 2. No bucks are permitted on the Fairgrounds.
- 3. All animals must be owned by the member, member's parents, or in partnership with his/her parents by May 1.
- 4. Market goats must be identified and fully castrated by the county registration date or will not show and willnot sell. Fair veterinarian and superintendents will have the final authority.
- 5. It is the responsibility of the club advisor and member to turn in entry forms according to county guidelines and verify that it is correct. **Error and missing exhibitor information will result in animals not being shown.

Underweight animals will not go through the livestock sale and will not be sold with the goat projects to the markets (member will have to make their own arrangements to remove any under- weight animals at release time of the fair.)
- 2. The market goat may be a wether or meat wether doe. Meat breed goats listed in section below.
- 3. Market Wethers and Market Wether Does will show in separate classes by weight.
- 4. Market Wether Does will not compete for Over all Grand and Reserve Champion.

- 6. Meat Class shall consist of any animal that has any percentage of a breed not mentioned in dairy breeds. The final decision of class determination will be made by the judge and superintendents at weigh-in.
- 7. Any animal producing a product going into the food chain can be subject to drug testing as requested by the judge and or show committee the day of show. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to insure that all medications are used within label guidelines. Any animal tested is at the owners' expense.
- 8. Awards given for Grand and Reserve Champion Light weight, Middle weight and Heavy weight classes for both Dairy and Boer. Light weight is 55-70 pounds; Middle weight is 71-90 pounds; Heavy weight is 91 and above pounds. These classes will compete for overall Grand and Reserve Champion of the Dairy and Boer.
- 9. The Grand and Reserve from both the Dairy Market and Meat Market wether show will be sold as the first four wethers sold in the goat sale, followed by all other goats by random draw
- 10. Grand Champion & Reserve Grand Champion Meat Market wether Goats WILL be tested per ODA rules.

All market animal exhibits must complete an online DUNF Form at weigh-in. ALL poultry, except waterfowl, show NPIP papers (hatchery papers), home hatched and raised turkeys show Blood Test Papers **BEFORE** weigh-in. Failure to produce these forms for each animal will prohibit the animals from being shown or sold at this Fair.

RELEASE TIMES

- All Market Rabbits and Market Poultry not going to market must be out of the barn between 8PM and 10PM after the Wednesday sale. Any exhibitor who does not clean their pen will have \$25 deducted from their sale checks.
- Breeding Rabbits & Breeding Poultry are not released until Friday at 8:00PM and NO Later than 10:00pm. Exhibitors needing to remove their animals before the release time must have a parent and club advisor meet with the Small Animal Superintendents immediately following check-in on Thursday to fill out an early release form. Any exhibitor that removes their animal before the release time, without an early release form, WILL NOT be eligible to show small animals the following year. NO EXCEPTIONS.

COOP CLEANING

- ALL PENS/COOPS are to be cleaned by 11AM daily (Do not clean during show times.) Cleaning must be done every day, using no more than 2 inches of bedding. Pens not cared for on a daily basis will be removed from the Fair and competitions at the discretion of the Superintendents, Extension Staff and Fair veterinarian.
- 2. ALL MEAT/MARKET PENS must be cleaned on Wednesday. NO EXCEPTIONS. Any exhibitor who does not clean their pen will have \$25.00 deducted from their sale check.
- **3. Breeding Rabbits & Breeding Poultry pens** must be cleaned within 1 hour of release on Friday evening. NO EXCEPTIONS. Any exhibitor who does not clean their pen WILL NOT be eligible to show the following year and a \$25 fee will be charged.

SALE NOTES

All rabbits and poultry in the Jr. Fair Small Animal Sale will be sent to market. An exhibitor wanting to take their animal(s) home MUST declare this at the weigh-in scale.

Buyers will only have the option to either take the animals home that night - live - or the buyer can send the animal to market. There is NO OPTION for a buyer to send animal(s) home with the child.

MARKET CHICKENS AND MARKET TURKEYS

Market Chickens - 1 Pen of 3 Cockerels per exhibitor each bird cannot exceed 7 pounds for Championship class. Ideal age 6-7 weeks. Minimum weight is 3.5 lbs. per bird. Hens weighed but not eligible for championship.

Market Tom Turkeys - 1 entry per exhibitor Ideal age 18 – 20 weeks. Hens weighed but not eligible for championship. Only turkeys 40 pounds or under will be considered for the Championship Class.

RABBIT & POULTRY SHOWMANSHIP

- 1. Participants must use one of their own project animals shown in Jr. Fair for showmanship.
- 2. Dress Code: See General Showmanship rules.
- 3. Judges will consider these points:
 - The general appearance of the animal cleanliness how fitted, behavior, etc.
 - The general appearance and handling by the exhibitor.
 - The ability of the competitor to maneuver the animal as directed by the judge.
 - The knowledge of show techniques and procedures as demonstrated by the exhibitor.
- 4. Rabbit Showmanship Age Divisions are Junior, Intermediate, and Senior. Divisions will be posted prior to show.
- 5. Poultry Showmanship Age Divisions are Junior, Intermediate, and Senior. Divisions will be posted prior to show.

SMALL ANIMAL SHOWMAN OF SHOWMAN

Overall Small Animal Showman of Showman will be determined in a Showman of Showman Contest with the first-place winners in each division of Rabbit and Poultry Showmanship classes. Divisions are Showman of Showman of :Meat Rabbits, Market Chickens, Market Turkeys, Breed Rabbits, and Breeding Poultry. Each exhibitor will show an entry selected by Jr. Fair Superintendents for each Division participating. All rules under "Large Animal Showman of Showman of Contest" are followed.

The species Showman of Showman (rabbit or poultry) is not eligible to participate in their respective species Showman of Showman contest until they are eligible by age for the next age division. Example: An Intermediate division winner, age 12, wins their species Showman of Showman. They cannot compete in showmanship until they are age 15–Senior division. Previous Small Animal Showman of Showman Overall winners are no longer eligible to enter the showmanship classes of the species in which they earned their right to compete in the Showman of Showman Overall contest. They are exempt from the interview requirement in subsequent years. Example: The Senior Rabbit Showman of Showman of Showman Overall. They cannot compete in Rabbit Showmanship in future years. This ruling corresponds to the General Showmanship Contest Rules.

RABBIT RULES

- 1. Animals must be owned and in possession of exhibitor by: Breeding Rabbits-May 1; Market (Meat) Rabbits 3 to 6 weeks old. Each Meat Rabbit must have an ear tattoo or a readable permanent marker. That tattoo must be entered in the 4honline entry. Exhibitors choose their own digit numbers.
- 2. Only cages are provided by the Montgomery County Fair. All bedding, feed and other animal care equipment is the responsibility of the exhibitor.
- 3. Rabbits must be checked in and out by a small animals superintendent and will not be allowed to be on exhibit if in unhealthy condition.
- 4. All market rabbits will sell in Jr. Fair Sale. Market rabbits must be raised at youth exhibitor's home or farm (unless prohibited by city ordinance) by June 15.
- 5. Rabbit Meat Pen: If the tattoo/marker numbers at Fair check-in do not match the tattoo/marker number on the 4honline entry, animals will not be accepted for exhibit and must go home.
- Rabbits must weigh between 3 & 6 pounds to qualify that pen for Grand or Reserve Grand Champion. Meat rabbits can be animals of same breed or can be mix of breeds. Members can bring and weigh-in 4 meat rabbits; but can only show 3 per pen.
- 7. All meat pens not taken home by sale buyer, will be sold at market price and picked up by our buyer. Time/date to be posted.
- 8. Best of Show Rabbit will be selected from all the Best of 4-Class & the Best of 6-Class Rabbits.





POULTRY RULES

NOTE: Poultry will be cooped by division and gender, not by club.

1. Animals must be owned and in possession of exhibitor by:

Breeding Birds, Layers – May 1

Market Turkeys - Ideal Age 18-20 weeks.

Meat Chickens - Ideal age is 6-7 weeks

Meat Chickens and turkeys must be owned within 48 hours of hatch and raised by their exhibitor.

- 2. Cages are provided by the Montgomery County Fair. All bedding, feed and other animal care equipment is the responsibility of the exhibitor.
- 3. ALL poultry must be checked in and out by a small animal superintendent and will be excused if in unhealthy condition.
- 4. Poultry meat chickens and market turkeys will sell in Jr. Fair Sale. Meat chickens and turkeys must be owned within 48 hours of hatch and raised by their exhibitor.
- 5. Meat Chickens Broilers Cockerels only; each chicken must weigh 7 pounds or under. Pullets will be weighed in, but not eligible for Championships. Members can bring and weigh-in 4 birds, but can only show 3. Ideal broilers are not over 7 weeks old. All meat pens sell. However, only broiler pens will be considered for championship class.
- Market Turkeys: Only tom turkeys will be eligible for Championship class. Market toms should be 18-20 weeks old. No minimum weight. Turkeys weighing over 40 pounds will not be considered for the Championship class. Hens will be weighed but not considered for Championship.
